FIRE PROCEDURES FOR DEVON RESIDENTS

A. If the alarms and strobes in the common area hallway are not activated, the alarm is specific to your unit.

- If you know that the alarm in your unit is due to a <u>fire</u>, pull the nearest hallway alarm pull station, go to the nearest east/west stair, and evacuate the building (see B).
- If you know that the cause of the alarm in your unit is <u>accidental</u> (such as cooking smoke, etc.), or you are not sure of the cause, close your bedroom door(s) and wait in the hallway outside your unit for a Devon employee to arrive. This may take several minutes. (If smoke reaches a bedroom detector, it will become a general building alarm and all occupants must evacuate.)
- Keep your residence door closed. (If smoke reaches the common area hallway detector, it will become a general building alarm and all occupants must evacuate.)
- When the Devon employee arrives, you <u>and/or</u> the Devon employee will need to enter your unit to determine if the cause is accidental, or due to a fire.
- If the cause is <u>fire</u>, do as above, pull the nearest hallway alarm pull station and evacuate the building (see B).
- If the cause is <u>accidental</u>, you <u>and/or</u> the Devon employee should correct the cause, clear smoke from the living room smoke detector, and the Devon employee will return to the lobby to reset the alarm panel.
- This will stop the sound from the alarms in your unit.

NOTE:

If an alarm is activated in a unit due to accident (cooking smoke, etc.), all alarms in that unit will sound until the lobby alarm panel is reset. **NEIGHBORS SHOULD NOT CALL 911.** If there is a fire emergency, **all** alarms in **all** units will sound, all residents must evacuate the building, and the Fire Department will be notified-by the alarm system.

B. If the alarms and strobes in the common area hallway are activated, it is a general building alarm and all occupants must immediately evacuate the building.

• CLOSE YOUR RESIDENCE DOOR AND LEAVE IT UNLOCKED.

- Residents who are able should go to the nearest east/west stair, descend to the first floor and exit to the rear of the building. <u>Do not assemble in the stairs or near the lobby. DO</u> <u>NOT STAY IN THE BUILDING.</u>
 - · Do not hold or prop stairwell doors open.
- <u>Do not go to the center stairs</u>, unless you are unable to use stairs. The elevators will be recalled to the first floor for use by the firemen.
- <u>All residents should go to</u> and assemble in the <u>14th Street parking lot</u>. Monitors will be near the pool building and near the Riverview Avenue side.
- First floor personnel should exit the nearest east/west exit <u>and assemble in the rear of the building.</u>
- Everyone will be given verbal instructions when it is safe to enter the building.
- <u>For those who are unable to walk down the stairs, go to the center stairs, enter the landing and sit on the stairs to the side. Leave the center of the stairs open for pedestrian traffic.</u>
- Wait in the stairwell for the firemen to bring you down by elevator. Firemen will be given a list of those needing help, but it may take some time to get to you because their first priority will be the source of the alarm.
- If there is <u>smoke in any stairwell</u>, <u>seek an alternate route</u>.
- If alarms end before firemen arrive, return to your units. When the alarm ends, a <u>monitor</u> will come down each stair to advise remaining residents.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- If an alarm sounds, do not call the doorperson. Do not call 911.
- Preplan <u>everything</u> you will need to do and take with you if an evacuation is necessary. Know what outerwear is needed and if any water, flashlight, medicine and keys will be needed. <u>Turn off</u> any gas or major appliances. Leave <u>bedroom doors open</u> and <u>hallway door unlocked</u>.
- Use <u>east</u> and <u>west stairs</u> to leave the building. If you are <u>slow</u> on the stairs, <u>use the handrail</u> and, at landings, <u>allow others to pass</u>.
- Anyone who exits to the front of the building should move around the building to the rear. <u>Do not</u> <u>congregate in front of the building.</u>
- <u>Center stair</u> is only for those unable to walk down stairs. <u>Wait</u> on the landing or steps for <u>firemen</u> to take you down by <u>elevator</u>.
- Pet owners are solely responsible for their pets. Pets must be restrained and under control, on a leash, or in a pet carrier. Keep leashes short.
- During an alarm, <u>no one is to remain in their unit</u>, unless you are unable to leave. <u>If you are unable</u> to leave your unit, place a damp towel across the bottom of your entrance door. <u>Leave your door</u> <u>unlocked</u>. Wait for firemen, or the alarm to stop.
- If you <u>smell smoke</u>, and <u>no alarm</u> is activated, <u>call the doorperson</u> (658-5380), or <u>call the Devon</u> <u>Office</u> (658-5366, M-F, 8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m.).
- If you suspect a fire, but no alarm has sounded, pull the nearest alarm box located:
 - In the hall near the <u>east or west stairs</u>, or
 - In the elevator service area at the door to the <u>center stairs.</u> ■
- The alarm notifies the <u>fire panel</u> on the first floor and <u>the Wilmington Fire Department. Leave the building.</u>
- If leaving your unit for an extended period of time, shut-off all major appliances and leave bedroom doors open.
